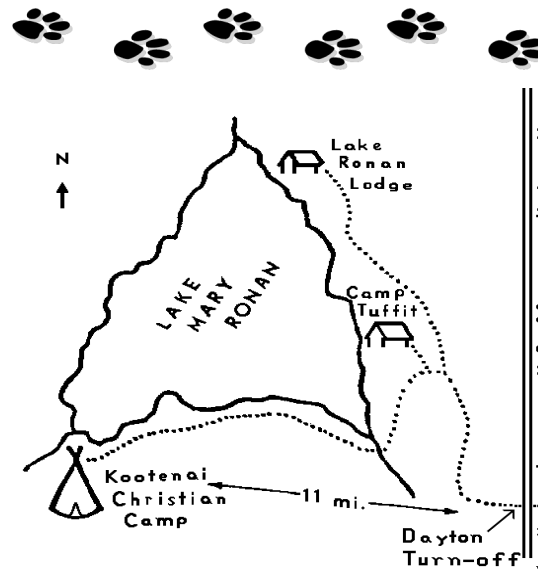

Reading books (other than the Bible)

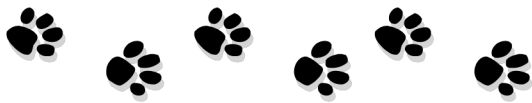
Tobacco, non-medicinal drugs, alcohol

Buildings generally are not available and the camp assumes no liability when camp is not in session. Memberships will not be available for anyone ever convicted of a sexually-based offense.

RULES FOR MEMBERS AND THEIR GUESTS

- No tobacco, alcohol, or drugs.
- No children under 18 unless with adult member.
- No pets in the campground.
- Clean up your litter. Take your trash out when you go.
- Be very careful with waste disposal, especially human.
- Do not drain wash water into the lake nor wash with soap-type products in the lake.
- NO** tree cutting!
- Report any vandalism to the camp manager.
- Leave all equipment in its proper place.



Be very careful with fire. Campfires are to be small and built down by the lake, in established fire rings only. Be sure all fires are dead out when you leave. Observe all State fire restrictions if any are in place.
